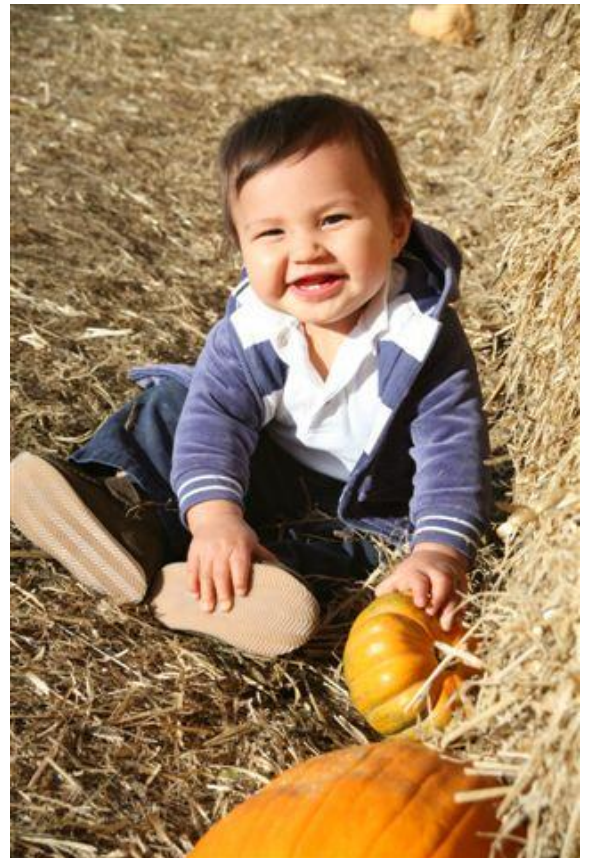


Heather (Carstens) Pedlar

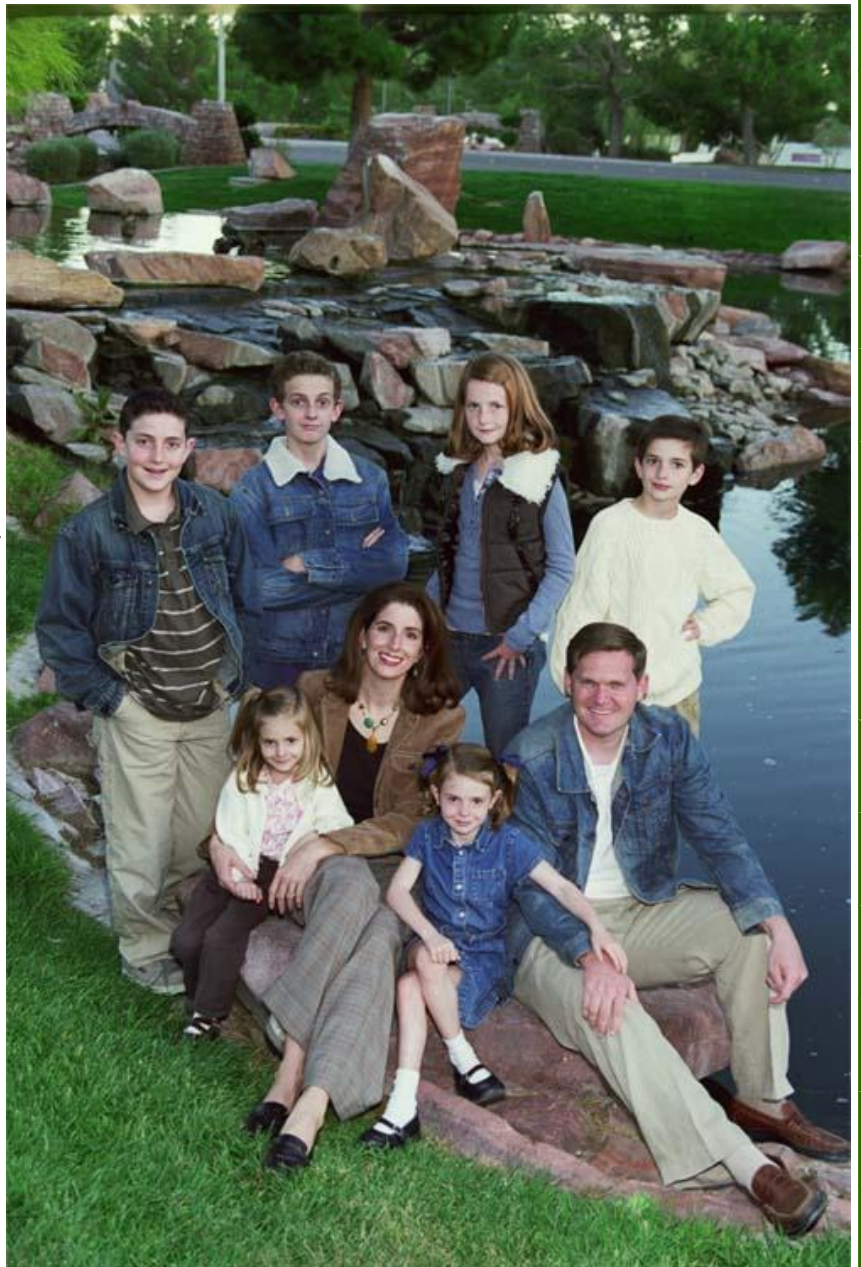
Laura (Fryer) Rawkins

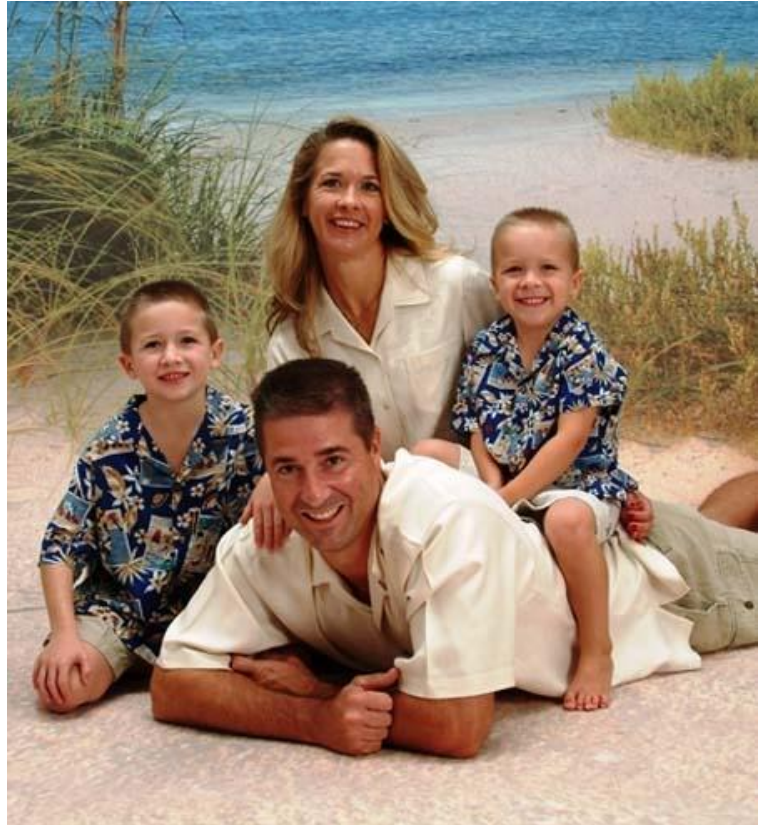

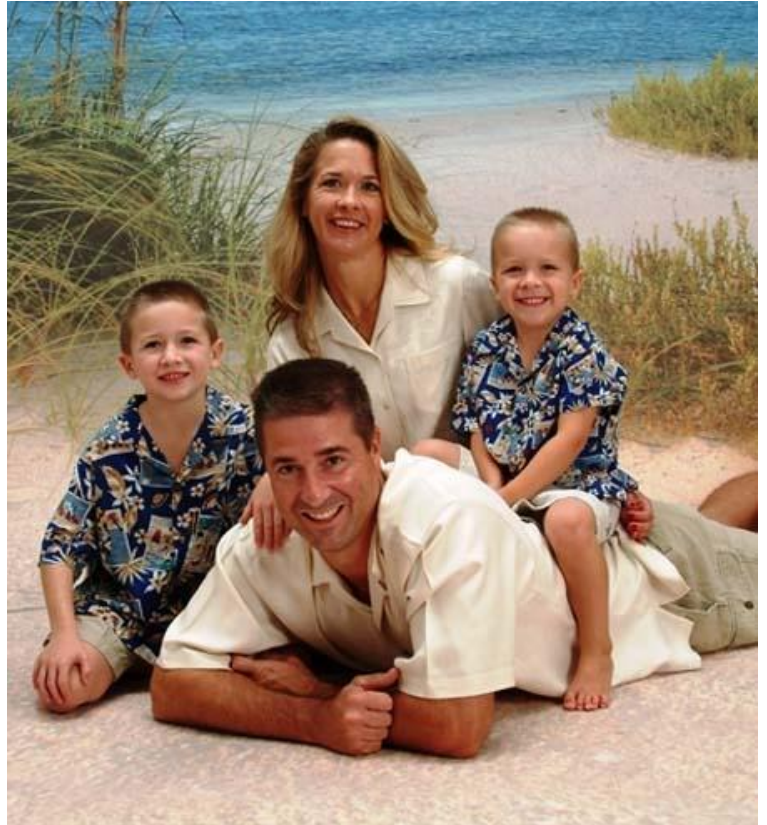
